The Disability Royal Commission helps protect the rights of people with disability.



The Disability Royal Commission wants to make sure people with disability are not

- Hurt
- Used
- Abused



There are other rights in the CRPD that fit into the work of the Disability Royal Commission.

You can see 2 examples on the next pages.



Example 1

If you live in a group home, you might not be able to go out when you want.



You might need to wait for a support worker to take you places.



That means your right to be a part of the community is not respected.



Example 2

You have the right to healthcare like everyone else.



But sometimes doctors are not accessible.



Sometimes doctors say your symptoms are part of your disability and do not give you good care.



That means your right to healthcare is not respected.

Make a submission to the Disability Royal Commission



If you think your rights are not respected, you can tell the Disability Royal Commission.

This is called making a submission.
